Today marks our first service of public worship in the benefice for over 3 months. We are looking forward to welcoming you to St Mary's, Reepham for Holy Communion at 10.30am on Sunday 12th, Sunday 18th and Sunday 26th July.

Social distancing measures will be in place and we are sorry to say that for the time being we will be **unable to serve coffee after the service or sit inside with our own drinks from home**. However we are able to chat outside after the service with social distancing in place.

For those who are unable to attend, the service will be recorded and will be available on the website's Virtual Church page from late afternoon on Sunday.

We are aware that for some people in our benefice there may still be some anxiety about returning to public worship. Therefore, from August we will be holding a weekly **Holy Communion service on Wednesdays at 11am** for those who may not feel comfortable mixing with larger numbers of people on Sundays or who have previously been shielding. The service will be held in the Chancel at St Mary's which will be roped off so that only those attending on a Wednesday will use this part of the church.

Romans 8:1-11

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans.

There is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, so that the just requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For this reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law – indeed it cannot, and those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you.

Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

From the Kitchen Window 10th July 2020

The dull and damp conditions have meant that insects have been hard to find, as they will have been tucked in cracks, crevices and under leaves waiting to the weather to improve.

With their preferred food source unavailable to them, the birds have been reliant on the food that we put out. Between them, the sparrows, blackbirds, robins, starlings, great and blue tits ate four fat balls yesterday, probably with the help of the Jay, although we didn't see him on the feeder.

We did enjoy watching two frogs travelling across the lawn in the rain however. They were not just hopping, but taking great leaps across what to them was a dangerous open space. There is beauty in the rain too, as Judith's photo of raindrops caught in a spider's web shows.

It is amazing that things that fly by night can also be beautiful. My father runs a moth trap in his garden when the weather is suitable. This is a light over an open box filled with egg cartons carefully stacked. The moths are attracted to the light and spiral down into the box, creeping between the stacking. In the morning, the racks are carefully removed to expose and identify the evening's occupants, before releasing them into the nearby vegetation. It is amazing just how many species of moth are present in any one location on any one night and over the course of a year my father can record up to 300 species. A few weeks ago, after easterly winds, he photographed a very attractive white moth with red veining at the base of the wings, merging into pale yellow in the centre. It was a very aptly named Beautiful Marbled, a migrant from mainland Europe, which was first recorded in this country in Dorset in 2004, but this year several were logged near the Norfolk coast, with one inland at East Tuddenham.
