# From the kitchen window 9<sup>th</sup> April 2021

The hedgerows are snowy white with Blackthorn blossom and the weather wintery: what in country weather lore is called a 'Blackthorn winter'. It has not deterred the birds from nesting, as Judith has been watching a Robin nest building and Dunnocks displaying. Our House Sparrows are busy pulling dead stalks from tussocks of ornamental grass and flying off purposefully with them.



Sue C has seen a young Hedgehog foraging, and we shepherded a Toad across a lane, so wildlife is definitely on the move. Tony and Celia have enjoyed watching the greening of their neighbour's Weeping Willow as the leaves unfurl. It looks stunning with their flowering magnolia in the foreground.



It is hard to remember that last week the temperature was up in the twenties and we were able to walk in shirt sleeves. One thing the pandemic has taught us is that concentrating on our 'local patch' is very rewarding. This was borne out yet again when we visited a very sandy bank in Booton where last year I found Mossy Stonecrop, a rare Breckland species. That year was very dry and few other plants were obvious, this year however, after the very wet winter there were many other plants reliant on dry sandy soil to be seen. Most are very small and flower early, as hot weather brings with it drought.



The bank was a mass of white Whitlowgrass but looking carefully we also found plants of Early Forget-me-not; only about an inch high but with many pale blue blooms surrounded by very hairy leaves. The hairs help the plant reduce water loss through the leaves. The best finds were the patches of Spring Vetch, which have very small, single, deep magenta and purple flowers; one of my favourite

Breckland species. When the weather improves we will go back and see if there are any more treasures to be found. It is possible to find other small overlooked plants nearer to home, such as the wonderful patch of Field Woodrush growing on Jolyon's front lawn. It also grows in the churchyard conservation area as it is a species of unimproved grassland, so well done Jolyon for not improving your lawn!
